RHETORICAL DEVICES: PATHOS, LOGOS & ETHOS

Logos: a logical appeal Explicit, factual, logical reasons to back up an argument – logical people are persuaded by facts and information Logos appeals use reason to back up a claim Easy to recognize! Facts, statistics, direct information, logical claims, etc Examples: “4,544 teens ages 16 - 19 were killed due to injuries caused in car

The Three Rhetorical Appeals: Ethos, Pathos, Logos The goal of argumentative writing is to persuade your audience that your ideas are valid, or more valid than someone else's The Greek philosopher Aristotle divided the means of persuasion, appeals, into three categories--Ethos, Pathos, Logos
